 Feeder steers & heifers fully steady with Tuesday's upturn. Slaughter cows .50-1.00 lower with weigh conditions not as attractive as Tuesday. Few slaughter bulls fully steady. Demand good for feeder cattle; fair for stockers. Activity only fair as buyer attendance greatly reduced from Tuesday's capacity crowd. Bulk of supply medium frame 1 600-850 lb. steers plus above average run of holstein steers and medium & large frame 1 & mixed 1-2 500-750 lb. heifers. Cows & bulls comprised just over 8% of actual auction sales.

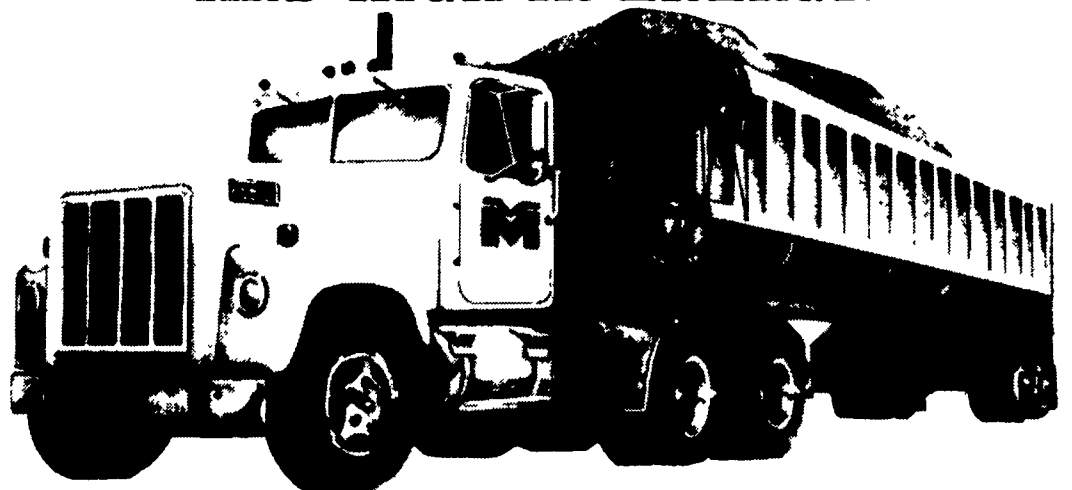
