**FARMI introduces new grain moisture tester**

ST. PAUL, MN - A grain moisture tester so tough it can withstand being run over by a tractor has been introduced by FARMI Electronics Corporation.

The FARMI 3000 Grain Moisture Tester features instant "ON" and automatic "OFF" controls and requires no initial calibration.

To practice a moisture reading, the operator simply fills the grain chamber with a handful of grain, screws on the cap, pushes the "test" button and reads the moisture percentage through the large display window. The unit provides automatic temperature compensation regardless of grain temperature.

In addition to the corn, wheat and soybeans shown in the display window the Model 3000 provides

readouts for up to 14 different grains and seeds, plus hay (with hay probe attachment).

A fine-calibration screw permits the operator to change the calibration  $\pm 1\%$  to agree more closely with the local elevator.

In addition to a two-year warranty on parts and workmanship - including damage from dropping - the company provides 10-year free calibration service.
