Slaughter steers 2.50 to 3.00 lower. Except Holsteins generally 1.00 to 2.00 lower. Slaughter heifers 2.00 to 2.50 lower. Cows 2.00 lower. Bulls 1.00 lower. Cow supply only about 4% this week.

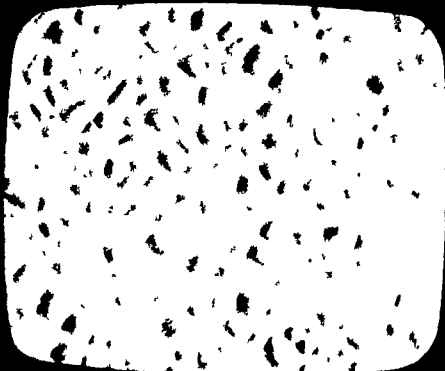

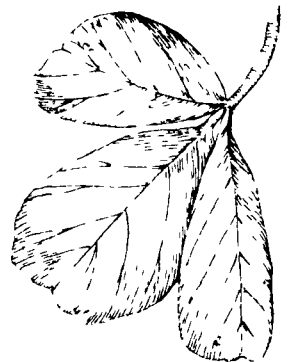
