USDA protects new plants

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Department of Agriculture has issued certificates of protection for 16 new varieties of beans, bermudagrass, cauliflower, celery, peas, soybeans and tomatoes. Also, a certificate of protection is being reissued for a variety of safflower.

Kenneth H. Evans, an official with USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, said developers of the newly protected varieties have the exclusive right to reproduce their products in the United States for 18 years. Certificates of protection are granted after review of the breeder's' records and claims that each new variety is novel, uniform and stable.

The following new varities have been issued certificates of protection:

the Pilgrim variety of bean, developed by Wilbur-Ellis Com-pany Seed Division, Spokane, pany Wash.

the Guymon variety of bermudagrass, developed by Oklahoma Agricultural Experiment Station and USDA's Agricultural Research Service, Stillwater, Okla.

 the Triton and Senator varieties of cauliflower, developed by Rijk Zwaan Zaadeelt en Zaadhandel, B.V., De Lier,

the James Abe variety of celery, developed by Bud Antle, Inc., Watsonville, Calif.

the Envy, Payload, Elegance, Vulcan and Trek varieties of peas, developed by Asgrow Company, Kalamazoo, Mich.

- the A6381, A6242 and A5980 varieties of soybean, developed by Asgrow Seed Company, Minneapolis, Minn.; and the S42-40 variety of soybean, developed by Northrup King Co., Minneapolis,

the Rio Colorado variety of tomato, developed by Petoseed Co., Woodland, Calif.; and the Easy Winner variety of tomato, developed by Campbell Soup Company, Campbell Institute for Research & Technology, Napolean, Ohio.

A certificate of protection has been reissued for S-137 safflower,

owned by SeedTec International, Inc., Woodland, Calif. The reason for the reissuance is to show that the variety is now being covered under Title V of the Plant Variety Protection Act.

The certificates of protection for Guymon bermudagrass and Pilgrim bean also were issued under Title V to be sold by variety name only as a class of certified seed.

The plant variety protection program, administered by USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, provides marketing protection to developers of new and distinctive seed-reproduced plants ranging from farm crops to flowers.

CCC loan rate at 734 percent

WASHINGTON - Commodity loans disbursed in August by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Commodity Credit Corporation will carry a 73/4 percent interest rate, according to CCC Executive

Vice President Everett Rank.

The new rate, down from 7-7/8 percent, reflects the interest rate charged CCC by the U.S. Treasury in July, Rank said.




