

Market Comment: Movement on ready to cook whole birds was fair good with satisfactory to clearances in most quarters. Breasts were well-cleared, while dark meat items were fully adequate to ample and were forced in some quarters. Slaughter schedules were heavy. Hot, humid weather was increased the number of DOA's, but plants have reported these increases as minor. Also the effects on weights and grade-outs were not of any significance today but were projected to-be a factor particularly if hot weather continues. Live supplies were adequate at irregular weights. Undertone ranges from steady to firm.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were 1 cent higher on U.S. Grade A at 49-56 cents.


