Compared with the previous week's close, slaughter steers and heifers 1.00 lower, cows and bulls 2.00 off. Feeder cattle fully steady.

Slaughter steers grading choice at 1100-1200 lbs. found good outlet all week from CME interests. Slaughter steer weights continued relatively heavy with many loads and lots high choice and prime steers in excess of 1300 lbs. This week's supply included 455 slaughter cows and bulls and 1110 head of feeder cattle. Quality of slaughter steers and heifers remains very attractive with 90% choice and dressing percentages well above normal. CME deliveries totaled 79 loads of slaughter steers and 35 loads of feeders. For 3 days this week slaughter steers averaged 1227 lbs. compared with 1245 lbs. last week and 1150 lbs. a year ago.
