CATTLE WEEKLY SUM-**MARY: Feeder Steers and Heifers** largely 2.00-3.00 lower with some calves fully 3.00-4.00 lower. Bulk Feeder supply over 500#. Feeder demand light. Very good spring and summer rains until recent weeks. Subsoil moisture good. However, hot dry windy weather past couple weeks has dried pastures and left inadequate surface moisture to sprout wheat in several areas. Slaughter Cows and Bulls steady to weak in face of light run. Slaughter Cattle demand fair.
