However, hot dry windy weather past couple weeks has dried pastures and left inadequate surface moisture to sprout wheat in several areas. Slaughter Cows and Bulls steady to weak in face of light run. Slaughter Cattle demand fair.

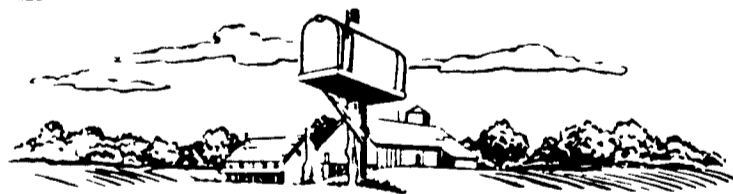
