Eastern Pa. & N.J. Poultry Wednesday, September 25 **Report supplied by USDA**

Market Comment: Overall trading curtailed due to the religious holidays. Seller offerings light but adequate for reduced schedules at lower trending prices. Some product noted sold as low as 121/2 cents picked up at farm and some moved outside to local area at 16 cents. Finished sales just fair with competitively priced broiler meat being used in some instances. Prices too few to mention.

Delmarva Poultry Thursday, September 26 **Report supplied by USDA**

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was fair to good and showing signs of picking up. Some sellers were attributing improvement to buying in advance of a rapidly approaching hurricane. Interest in parts centered on a good call for lime-run breast. Other items met a fair to generally improved call. The cutlets were slow to clear at some points. Live supplies were generally adequate. Weights were irregular but mostly desirable to light. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy today with most plants noting a good possiblity as down-time tomorrow due to the storm. The undertone was steady to fully steady.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were unchanged on U.S. Grade A at 45-52 cents.




