Market Comment: Demand for both whole birds and parts was light to fair and unaggressive. Clearances were in a range of slow to fair for the most part. Discounting on leg and leg quarters was commonplace in an effort to keep stocks in balance. Other items met a mixed but generally no better than fair call overall. Live supplies were fully adequate. Weights remained mostly desirable to heavier than desired. Slaughter schedules were a bit lighter and moderate in total. The undertone was unsettled but generally only steady.
