Some price erosion was noted however, at midweek, when wholsale beef realizations sagged Purchases of steers suitable for C.M.E. deliveries added some support to the market Monday Overall finish proved fairly attractive, although over-fat' and/or 'over-weight' kinds still presented some extent and discounted sharply.
