University history professor, as president.

Jolly, who is also president of Millersville Borough Council, has been at the local college since 1966. Although he does not have an agricultural background, he said he felt the effort was an important contribution to the quality of life in Lancaster County.

"I believe that agriculture greatly contributes to Lancaster County being prosperous, at-

tractive and unique," he said. The farming life, he said, "contributes to a wholesome physical and social environment."

"I feel the county's residents should feel responsible to be good stewards of the 'Garden Spot.'"

Other officers in the group include Jean Sonntag, vice president; Barbara Skelly, secretary; Robert Campbell, publisher of Lancaster Farming, finance chairman; and Eric Probst, Marilyn Lewis and Amos Funk, directors.

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA — Carolyn Belczyk, associate county agent for the Penn State Cooperative Extension Service in Erie County, received an Achievement Award from the National Association of County Agricultural Agents.

As 4-H program coordinator in Erie County, Belczyk oversees a program comprised of 952 members, led by 135 adult volunteers in 44 clubs and special interest groups. The Erie County 4-H program has an exceptionally high level of leader involvement in planning, executing and evaluating 4-H activities.

In 1977, Belczyk introduced the Rats for Good Nutrition program, a unique animal feeding demonstration that has been used to teach Erie County children the basis for good nutrition. It was introduced as a state program for 4-H EFNEP (Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program) participants in 1981.

Therapeutic Riding for the

Handicapped has been another of Belczyk's successful programs. The program now operates as a nonprofit corporation involving two riding stables, six community agencies, three volunteer riding instructors, and more than 50 other volunteers.

In 1981 Belczyk began working with the Erie Area Lions Club to develop the Leader Puppy program for the blind. She helped establish an advisory group to oversee puppy health care and placement and to develop programs to recognize members and their dogs.

Belczyk is currently working on a master of business ad-

ministration degree from the Behrend College of Penn State and holds a bachelor of science degree in recreation and youth leadership from Michigan State University.

She is an active member of both the Pennsylvania and National Associations of County Agricultural Agents and was a national winner of the NACAA Career Guidance Award in 1978. In 1984 she was first place winner in the Direct Mail Category of Communications Awards sponsored by the PACAA.

Belczyk is the daughter of Roy and Lucille Danforth of Chardon, Ohio.

the national debt and did not work on the bill.

The upper house is expected to return to the Farm Bill debate early next week. It did take the time, however, to pass a bill extending current ag policy for 30 days, until Dec. 13.
