Open Market Lambs

Dick Kuzemchak, shepherd for the Penn State University flock, was modest, but admittedly pleased, when judge Ron Guenther of Columbus, Ohio, selected the college's first-place Suffolk as the 1985 open market lamb champion. "We had a lot of hopes for him,"

we had a lot of nopes for him," said Kuzemchak about the winning wether. "He was exceptional, a pretty good lamb."

The university maintains three flocks, a commercial, and one each of purebred Suffolks and Dorsets. Because the flocks are used primarily for teaching and research, a show win like the KILE championship is a real bonus.

"We're not geared to showing," said Kuzemchak, "so it's a good
