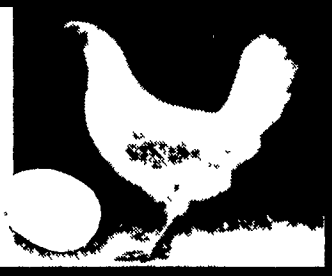

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds is tapering but most plants managed to clear offerings satisfactorily. The bulk of trading on part items is generally marked by sharp discounting and slow movement, particularly on breast and leg items.

Live supplies are at least adequate. Weights were trending lighter but still in a full range. Slaughter schedules are being trimmed and were very light in total. The undertone was at least barely steady.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were unchanged on U.S. Grade A at .54-.61 cents.
