
### **POULTRY MARKETS**



#### Philadelphia Eggs Wednesday, Nov. 2 Report supplied by USDA

Market Comment: Prices were unchanged. Cartoned egg movement was mixed but fairly good overall. Some slowing in demand was noted in a few quarters. Floor stocks were adequate at most points and clearances were irregular. Additional offerings were noted as available in both graded and ungraded packs, particularly jumbos and some instances mediums. The undertone was steady but cautious.

Live supplies were generally in balance to fully adequate. Weights were mixed in a fully range. Slaughter schedules were very light with all plants down for the Thanksgiving holiday and spot closings planned for Friday. Undertone was about steady.
