

That bale MUST represent all the bales on that lot! Keep pole burned tobacco in a separate lot. Keep the green out of your tobacco. DO NOT strip your tobacco too damp. When storing tobacco on the farm, stack your bales so that all sides of the bale are exposed to the air.

PLEASE BRING YOUR NICEST TOBACCO TO THE FIRST AUCTION AS THIS WILL STIMULATE AND MAINTAIN BUYER INTEREST IN YOUR CROP.

It is still important that you get your name and other information to us for scheduling. Do not wait til the last minute.

We have scheduled an open house for you to inspect the facilities, see how tobacco will be prepared for auction and educate you on how to strip and grade your tobacco.
