

Market Comment: Prices were unchanged under a weak and 13 loads; Alfalfa 84.00 to 96.00/ton; unsettled market tone. Cartoned Mixed 55.00 to 80.00/ton; Straw egg movement varied but was 74.00/ton. generally only fair at best. Graded and ungraded supplies were in excess overall and competitively priced in an effort to improve movement. Some traders were attempting to set retail featuring in an effort to stimulate consumer buying.


