Live prices decline in reaction to lower wholesale beef price late last week and early this week. Slaughter steers closed 2.00 to 2.50 lower; heifers 2.50 to 3.00 lower. Cows mostly 3.00-3.50 lower. Bulls closed weak to 2.00 lower. Supply mainly good to average choice slaughter steers and heifers with 14% cows. Estimated receipts 2200 compared with 1936 a week ago and 1906 a year ago.
