Or create a ceramic-like glaze on last year's plastic flowers, then use these flowers to make one-of-akind fashion jewelry.

All these different applications are the result of a few easy steps with Ultra-GloTM from Chemco.

Before beginning with any polymer gloss finish, there are a few general directions that will help assure safe and satisfactory results.

Protect the working area with several layers of newspaper, wax paper or plastic wrap. Set out the project to be sealed in a dust-free environment with good ventilation.

You will want to elevate the pieces on a pedestal prop such as an old coffee can. Use masking tape or paste wax to prepare and mask the backs of the project for easy drip removal. And be sure to have a dust cover, the proper size, to protect the items while they dry. The dust cover should be large enough to not touch the drying

Be sure the Ultra-GloTM materials are properly mixed. Too much of either the hardener or the resin will change the consistency. The amount of humidity in the air will affect the drying and final effect. So, if the humidity is above 60 percent, you should use a dehumidifier. Carefully reading the instructions on the package will go a long way to successful holiday ornaments.

Pine Cone

Straw Flower Wreath

First bake the cones in an oven for 1 hour at 275°F. in a foil-lined cookie sheet to rid the cones of any insects. Do not microwave; the results can be very messy.

Using a wire wreath frame, attach a piece of wreath-shaped

poster board (at least an inch wider than the diameter of the frame). Glue or secure the poster board with heavy duty tape to the frame. This will give you a ledge to attach the cones to. Begin by gluing the cones to the outside and inside of the frame (see diagram).

Next, glue the pine cones so they completely cover about two-thirds of the top portion of the frame (see diagram). The bottom one-third of the frame should be covered with naturals such as wheat, pods, dried strawflowers and any other festive items. Be sure that all open spaces are completely full and the glue dried completely before

coating with Ultra-GloTM.

Using empty paper cups, prop up the wreath on the protected work area. Measure and mix the Ultra-Glo™, following the coverage chart and instructions included in the kit. Drizzle the Ultra-GloTM back and forth in a criss-cross manner over all cones and flowers. Leave one ounce of Ultra-GloTM in a cup and use a brush to coat any uncovered areas.

The wreath can be displayed indoors or outdoors and can be easily stored by simply wrapping it in tissue paper until next season.




