

Papillon, TransAgra aid ADA/DC dairy promotions

SYRACUSE, N.Y. — Two agribusinesses specializing in forage technologies and agriculture research and marketing are teaming up with the American Dairy Association and Dairy Council to promote dairy products:

As an incentive to area dairymen to participate in a series of forage seminars, Papillon Agricultural Products and TransAgra International Inc., will continue money toward the purchase of milk promotion billboards.

For each dairyman who attends

one of the seminars, which will be held throughout the Northeast, the corporate sponsors and local feed dealers will purchase 6'x10' "Milk's Got More" billboards from the American Dairy Association and Dairy Council.

The ADADC, located in Syracuse, NY and Williamsport, PA is a dairy farmer funded and directed milk marketing agency serving New York, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey. Dairymen who attend the seminar will have a sign placed in their area.

The seminars will provide area

farmers with forage production information. Highlights of the event will include two presentations given by faculty members from Kansas State University and New Mexico State University.

Their research topics include the role of fermentation aids insilage management and the benefits of bailing hay at a higher percent moisture.

Another feature of the seminar series will be the introduction of the product Culbac. Culbac is a low cost, non-acid hay and silage preservative. A presentation will be made on the use of Culbac in higher moisture hay and its use in haylage and silage.
