His supervised occupational experience includes beef finishing, corn for grain, oats, wheat, hay and corn silage.

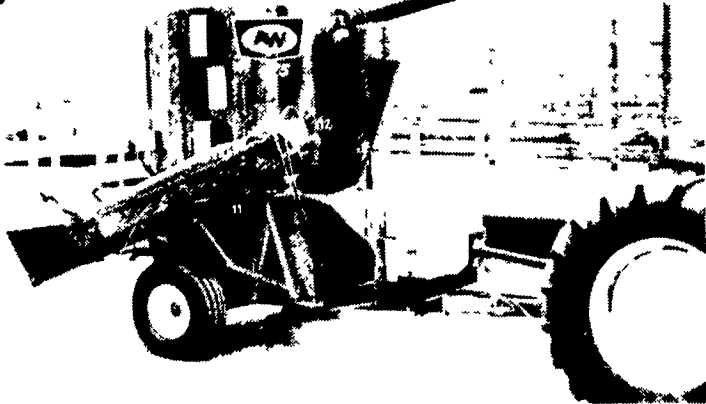
Craig has participated on the FFA public relations committee and the banquet committee and attended the Pennsylvania Leadership Conference at Indiana
