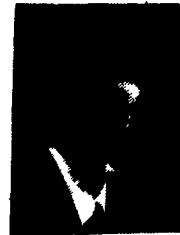
He participated in wrestling in freshman through senior years of high school. He plans a career as a dairy farmer. His hobbies include wrestling, traveling, softball and football.
