Phil has judged dairy cattle, dairy products and meats at the local, county and state levels and has earned the Greenhand, Chapter Farmer and Red Rose Degrees.

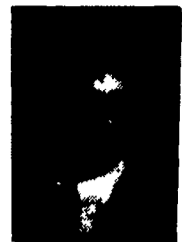
His projects have included market lambs, hogs and capons. He is currently serving as treasurer of the Indiantown Church Youth Group and plans to pursue a career in carpentry.
