Following graduation, he plans to work on his father's farm.

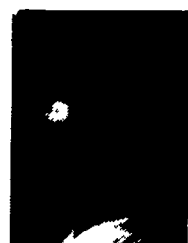
Rodney L. Nissley

He also participated in BOAC at the Elizabethtown Fair.

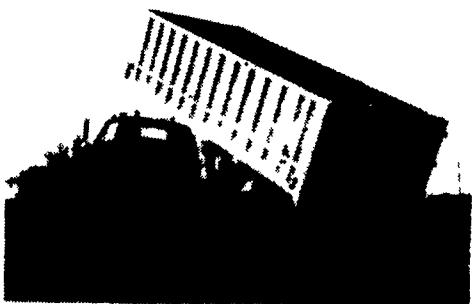
