The son of Gary Harner and Sandy Angst, Brent has received the Greenhand and Chapter Farmer degrees, and was the Star Farmer for Northumberland County.

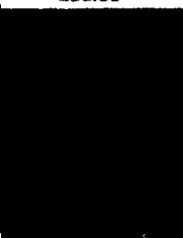
He placed among the top 20 in the livestock judging competitions at Penn State during the last two years.

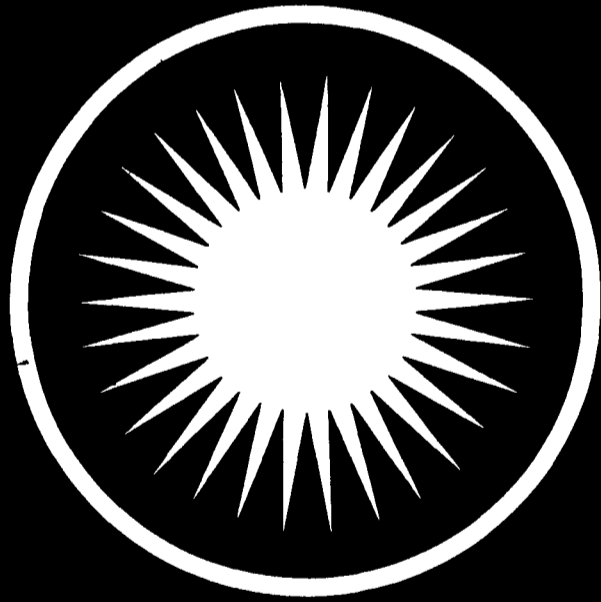
