During the month there were 127 herds with 7 212 cows processed in the D H I A program, according to Alan P Kozak, County Agent. Production ranged from a high of 60 7 pounds of milk, testing 3 7 percent fat to a low of 17 9 pounds of milk, testing 4 9 percent fat. In the owner sampler program there were 20 herds with 748 cows being processed. The herds ranged from a high of 79 2 pounds of milk, testing 3 4 percent fat to a low of 24 8 pounds of milk, testing 3 8 percent fat.

The ten high individual cow actual production records in D H I A produced on a two times a day milking in 305 days or less (unless otherwise indicated) were in the following herds

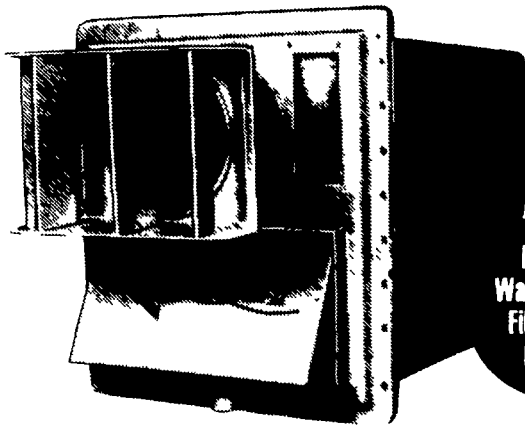
