Additional offerings were noted as available with spot loads of class one nest runs reportedly moved in a range of 52 to 54 cents.

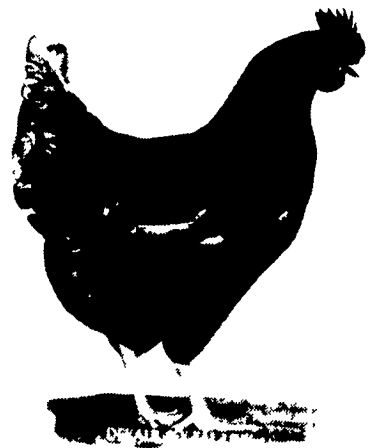

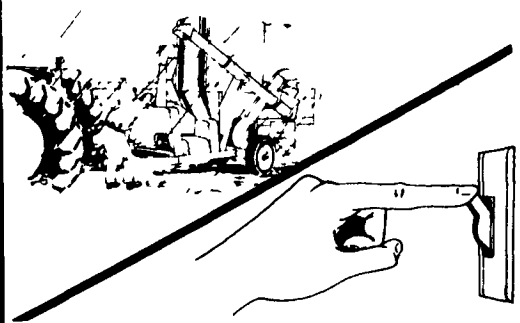
