Inter-State meeting slated

SOUTHAMPTON, Pa. — The Lykens Valley Local of Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative District 7 will hold its annual dinner meeting Feb. 18 at 11:45 a.m. at the Killinger Grange Hall, Millersburg, Director Daniel I. Martin announced.

Guest speaker will be Robert M Dever, Inter-State assistant general manager. Dever will review the cooperative's goals for 1986 and will discuss the dairy provisions of the 1985 Farm Bill.

A business meeting will be conducted by Ernest Klinger, Lykens Local president, to elect officers and delegates for the coming year.

Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative District 7 covers Lebanon County, western Lancaster County and eastern Dauphin County.

Each local elected their officers for the coming year. Winning the Quarryville Local election was: president, Douglas Hershberger; vice president, David Longenecker; and secretary-treasurer, Karl Herr.

The new officers for the Christiana Local are: Ivan Bowman, president; Levi K. Glick, vice president; and James Bowman, secretary-treasurer.

Curtis Akers, Director of District 12, reported that Inter-State last year marketed 2.46 billion pounds

of milk that had a value of \$335.7 million. He also reported that 25.5 percent of this milk received quality premiums.

David Longenecker reported on the activities of the Young Cooperators this past year.

Guest speaker James Fraher,

economist for Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative, spoke on the basic points which are included in the new farm bill, and outlined the assessment schedule in conjunction with the increases planned for the blend price.

He also listed who he felt would be the mostly likely entries into the buyout program. The farmer who plans on retiring in the next five years, financially stressed far-

mers who may be forced to liquidate in the near future, and finally those individuals who simply don't know if they should stay in the dairy business any longer.

It was also pointed out by Curtis Akers that any member who enters into the buyout program will be eligible to get their capital retained back within one year as in the current agreement.

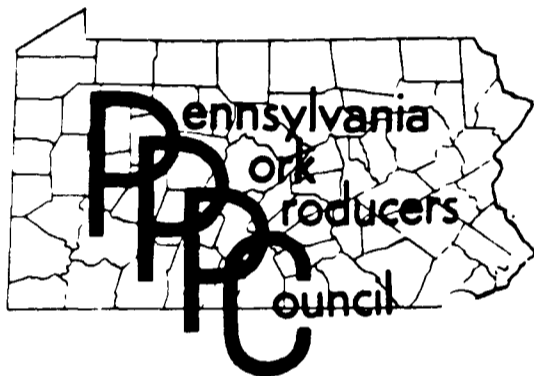
