Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds and part items was light to only fair and generally disappointing. Whole body clearances were just fair at best. Movement of parts was slow to fair on most items, and discounting was a factor and stimulating demand in several quarters. Live supplies were at least adequate. Weights were in a full range but mostly light to desirable. Slaughter schedules were moderate in total. The undertone remained barely steady to weak.

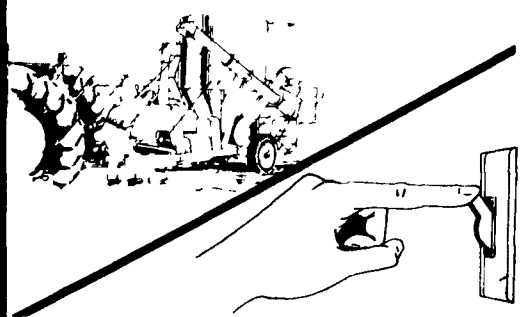
