Feeder steers and heifers about steady on sparse receipts, but not enough this week for an average test. Slaughter cows and bulls fully steady. Weather clear past two days but bitter cold hampering movement and demand. Predictions call for high in the 60's by the weekend.

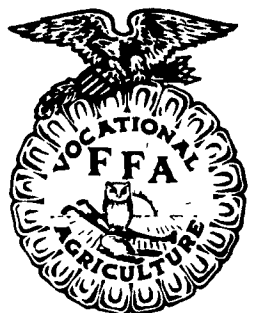
