## Lebanon 4-H'ers hold fall roundup

LEBANON—The pork outnumbered the beef by a wide margin at the Lebanon 4-H Pig and Steer Fall Roundup on Jan. 4.

The sale's 89 hogs sold for \$11,839 for a sale average of 75 cents per pound. The four steers sold for \$4,732, for an average beef price of \$1.05 per pound. Both averages include champions.

Top selling steer was Daryl Bomgardner's entry that went

home with David Martin of Dutchway Farm Market for \$4 a pound. Shelby Heagy's reserve champion went to Lebanon Valley National Bank for 95 cents a pound.

Miss Heagy also topped the hog show, and earned \$4 a pound for her grand champion from Harold Bucher representing Peoples National Bank.

The sale's 35 buyers paid nearly \$17,000 for the 93 head of livestock.

## American Pork Congress to offer sulfa testing

ST. LOUIS, MO.—Pork producers who attend the 1986 American Pork Congress at St. Louis, March 11-13, will have an opportunity to have a sample of their hog herd's finishing ration or urine sample tested to determine sulfa residue levels. The free testing program will be conducted during all three days of the Pork Congress. Producers may bring

their samples to the Production Information Center (Room 260-264 at the A. J. Cervantes Convention Center) during regular Trade Show hours for their free and confidential test evaluation.

The sulfa residue problem, and what the pork industry can do about it, will also be a major topic of discussion during a Swine Health Seminar to be held on

Thursday, March 13, at the Pork Congress.

Over 500 exhibits featuring all of the latest technology and services associated with the pork industry will be on view each day of Pork Congress, an annual event sponsored by the National Pork Producers Council as a service to the U.S. pork industry.

## Walter Brooks' bull goes to ABS

A young Holstein bull, Brooks-Twain Memorial Craig-ET, bred by Walter Brooks, of Springville, PA, has been selected by American Breeders Service to enter their Progeny Testing Program.

He has been moved to that company's facilities at DeForest, Wisconsin, where he will join approximately 200 bulls being tested this year. During testing,

Brooks-Twain Memorial Craig-ET will be mated to 700 cows in herds associated with ABS in their testing program, from all across the United States. After a four-year wait, during which his progeny will be evaluated, a decision will be made as to whether or not he enters into regular semen production.

Brooks-Twain Memorial Craig-ET is the result of a specially planned mating between the highly regarded LeMax Pawnee Memorial, +155, +1204M and +51BF and Folley Elevation Cheryl. His dam has production records to 32,660 lbs. of milk. She is classified EX-93 and is sired by Round Oak Rag Apple Elevation.
