

SPRING TILLAGE SPREADS QUACKGRASS. ROUNDUP'STOPS IT COLD. AND THAT'S A FACT.

First, use 5 to 10 gallons of water per

acre. Next, add non-ionic surfactant.

(Use 2 quarts per 100 gallons of spray solution for surfactants containing more than 50% active ingredient. Or 4 quarts per 100 gallons for those with less than 50% active ingredient.) Finally, apply with flat fan nozzles. (You want the spray pattern to overlap.)

Roundup. Or tillage. The choice is yours. But if you don't want quackgrass to wind up costing you *real money*, there really is *no* choice: it's Roundup.
