

Market Comment: Demand and movement of ready to cook whole birds was irregular but no better than fair in total. Offerings were adequate to ample and premiums were adjusted lower in some instances in an effort to clear product. Demand for parts was dull in total. However, some spot interest was developing at current levels. All items were at least adequate with leg quarters more readily available.

Live supplies were at least adequate overall. Weights were desirable to lighter than desired. Slaughter schedules were

moderate. The undertone was barely steady.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were unchanged on U.S. Grade A at .50-.58 cents, but some lots had moved as low as .49 cents and some truckload at .47-.49 cents.


