

It is our opinion that your support of the auction, and your strength in numbers to hold your Type 609 tobacco until the auction opened, brought the market prices of your Type 609 tobacco to acceptable market prices. It is our opinion that the Type 41 tobacco market prices were acceptable on TOP quality Type 41 tobacco.

It is up to you farmers to decide what to plant next year!

We feel that demand will be here for Type 609 tobacco; however, it is important to remember that demand is strongest in December and January and quality will be very important. We feel that demand will continue to exist for Type 609 largely due to lower support prices in the Burley markets. We also feel that there will continue to be a demand for local Type 41 tobacco. Quality again will be very important. Hopefully we have stimulated more demand for this type of leaf through the work of various southern buyers.

We have already begun to prepare for next years tobacco marketing season. We will do everything we can this year to create more demand in our locally grown tobacco leaf. We will also be working and supporting various publications in Lancaster Farming providing information on planting, growing, harvesting, & marketing your tobacco.

We will continue to have phone hours to answer any questions you may have on Tuesdays & Wednesdays from 1 to 5 p.m.
