Individuals in rural communities face a multi-faceted problem. "There is not a central focus," he said of the information available. He sees the need for a "clearinghouse for information." Support groups bare not as available in rural areas according to Teffeau, and this makes for problems with rural transportation. Thirdly, Teffeau said, "buildings are not accessible" to disabled individuals, and often are built in violation of section 504 of the Vocational Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

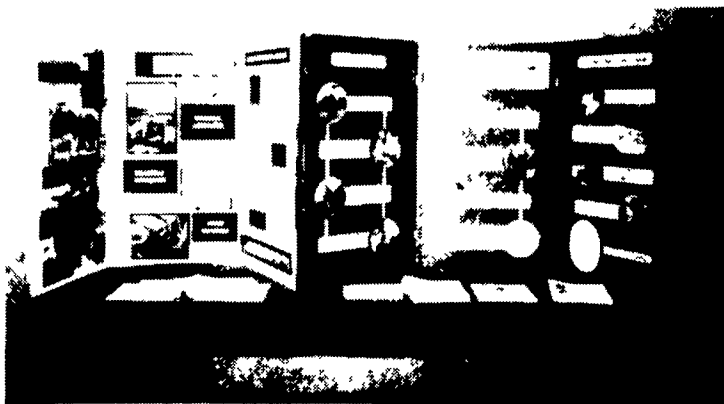

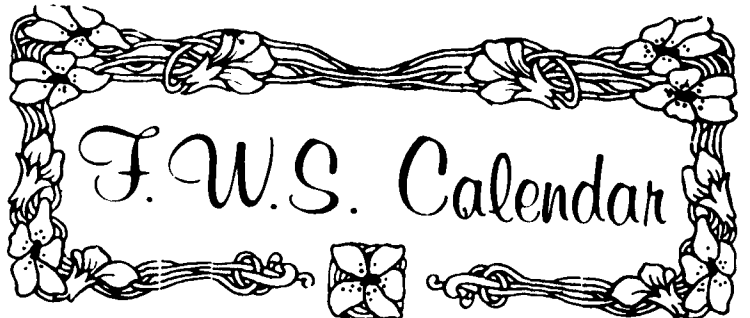
