
At the First Annual Chesapeake Bay Conservation Awards, held last month in Washington, D.C.. Wolff received the Agriculture Award from Izaak Walton League for his efforts to reduce runoff from agricultural land in the Chesapeake Bay drainage basin.

In Nashville, earlier this year, Wolff was honored by the National Association of Conservation District Directors with a Special Recognition Award to recognize his outstanding contributions to conservation programs, specifically his efforts in the Chesapeake Bay cleanup.

Recognized nationally for his expertise and leadership in agriculture and conservation, Wolff served on the first Environmental Protection Agency task force to develop a policy and strategy on non-point source pollution. He represented the Commonwealth on the Citizens Advisory Committee to the Chesapeake Bay Executive Council and was recently appointed as one of seven Pennsylvania representatives to the Chesapeake Bay Commission.
