## Farm Bill meeting set at Penn State

STATE COLLEGE — Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture Richard Grubb, agricultural leaders and Penn State faculty will present a panel discussion on the 1985 Farm Bill in room 112 Kern at 7:30 p.m., Tuesday, April 1. The coffeehouse is sponsored by Ag Student Council and the public is invited to attend.

Other guest speakers include Charles Wismer, State Grange Master, Gene Thompson, Pennsylvania Executive Director of the USDA Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, Jill Findeis, assistant professor of agricultural economics, and Milton Hallberg, professor of agricultural economics, who will moderate the discussion.

Dr. Grubb will discuss the impact of the farm bill on Pennsylvania agriculture, and Wismer, a dairy farmer and state lobbyist for the State Grange, will address the development of the bill and the Grange position on it. Thompson will present USDA's position and discuss how the bill will be implemented in Pennsylvania.

Findeis will discuss the economic implications of the bill.

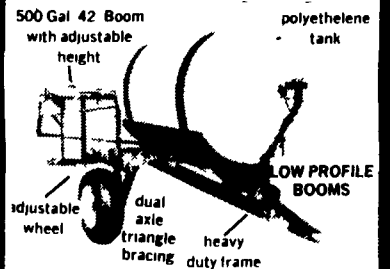

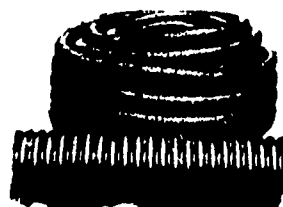
