Public wants to preserve ag land, Delaware poll finds

DOVER, DE — The Delaware Department of Agriculture released the results of an opinion survey of adult Delawareans conducted by the University of Delaware indicating that 88% responding think that farmland loss is a serious problem in Delaware.

In other responses 75% supported a new north/south highway with minimal impacts Delaware farmland while 86% disagreed with the concept of lowest cost roads regardless of the impacts on farmland.

"This shows that the public is squarely behind state projects only if they respect our best farmland, according to Agriculture Secretary, William B. Chandler, Jr., "The survey results show that the public supports the kind of cooperation we saw between agriculture and the Department of Transportation during the Route 13 route selection process."




