The group is planning a trip to Raystown Dam in June. The group will celebrate its 26th anniversary with a meeting at Denny's Restaurant on Route 30 in May.



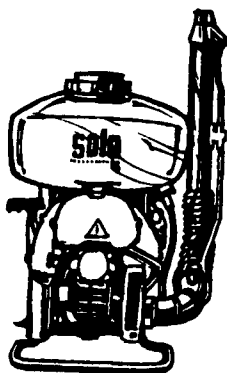

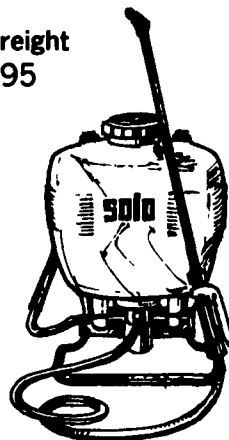

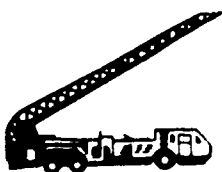
