## March milk price announced

ALEXANDRIA, VA – Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine today announced a March 1986 base milk price of \$12.33 per hundredweight and an excess milk price of \$10.89. The weighted average March price was \$12.30 and the butterfat differential for the month is 15.8 cents.

The base milk price was down 27 cents from February and was \$1.20 lower than last March. The weighted average price was down 15 cents from February and was \$1.14 lower than a year earlier. The gross value of March producer milk was \$68.0 million, compared to \$71.1 million a year ago.

Mr. Shine said that producer receipts totaled 554.6 million pounds during March, an increase of 24.0 million pounds from last March, and the average daily delivery of 2,674 pounds per

producer increased 135 pounds or 5.3 percent from a year earlier.

Class I producer milk totaled 244.3 million pounds and was up nearly one million pounds or fourtenths of one percent from last March. Class I milk accounted for 44.05 percent of total producer milk receipts during the month, com-pared with 45.88 percent in March 1985.

Base milk accounted for 91.52 percent of total producer milk receipts in March compared with 88.68 percent last year. The average butterfat test of producer milk was 3.78 percent, up from 3.74 percent last March.

Middle Atlantic Order pool handlers reported Class I in-area milk sales of 211.4 million pounds during March, an increase of eighttenths of one percent from a year earlier after adjustment to eliminate variation due to calendar composition.
