Market Comment: Prices continued to trend lower on all sizes. Demand was light to fair and generally unaggressive at all levels of distribution. Graded supplies ranged adequate or available, particularly mediums and large. Gradable supplies at local and distant production points were currently in excess of packer needs, and breakers offered little option, as most limited receipts in anticipation of lower asking prices for breaking stocks.

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was generally disappointing, and offerings remained available at

negotiable terms. Inquiry for parts was also disappointing, and the bulk of trading on most items was at discounts to yesterday's pricing. Less than trucklot asking prices were two to three cents lower at 58-65 cents. Live supplies remained at least fully adequate. Weights were in full range, but mostly desirable to heavier than desired. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy. The undertone continued weak.

Slaughter steer and heifer prices closed this session steady with last week. Demand was fairly good for the two days of trading this holiday shortened week. Carcass beef prices held steady through mid-week, but boxed beef prices were firm.

Slaughter cows closing mostly 1.00 higher, slaughter bulls firm to 1.00 higher.

Estimated 4 day receipts this week 5500 compared to 5 day actuals last week of 7818 and 8914 last year. Slaughter steers accounted for 47 pct of the weeks receipts. Slaughter heifers 44 pct, slaughter cows 6 pct and feeder cattle 1 pct.

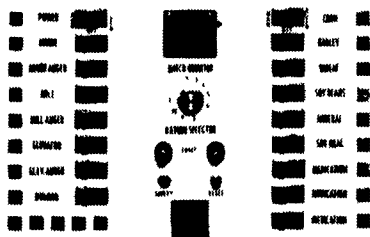
