CREAMY RASPBERRY SQUARES

- 18 chocolate sandwich cookies, finely rolled
- ¼ cup margarine, melted
- 2 3-ounce packages or 1 6-ounce package raspberry or strawberry gelatin
- 1¾ cups boiling water
- 1 13-ounce can evaporated milk, chilled
- 1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened
- 1 10-ounce package frozen raspberries in light syrup, thawed or 1 9-ounce package frozen sliced

strawberries, thawed
Prepared whipped topping for garnish, optional

In medium bowl, combine cookie crumbs and margarine; mix well. Press into bottom of 8x8-inch baking dish. Chill.

In large bowl, dissolve raspberry gelatin in boiling water. Stir in chilled evaporated milk. Pour half of mixture into blender container or food processor, add half of cream cheese. Process until smooth and creamy; pour into large bowl. Repeat with remaining gelatin mixture and cream cheese. Fold in raspberries and syrup.

Chill until slightly thickened; pour into prepared crust. Chill until firm, about 3 hours. Cut into squares to serve. If desired, garnish with prepared topping.

Craft Days Planned at Pennsylvania Farm Museum

LANCASTER — The thirtieth annual "Craft Days" weekend will be held Saturday and Sunday, June 7 and 8, from noon until 5 p.m. at the Pennsylvania Farm Museum of Landis Valley.

"Craft Days" is an outdoor festival featuring demonstrations of more than 50 different crafts and activities associated with Pennsylvania life from 1750 to 1900. At Craft Days visitors will see how to rope a bed, bake in an outdoor oven or make a basket.

On Saturday, June 7, Susan Campbell and Paul Lamoreaux, "The Goat Getters," who perform traditional music and crafts, will hold children's workshops at 1 and 3 p.m. on square dancing and the use of limberjacks (dancing dolls). There will also be other crafts at which children and adults may try their hand.

On Sunday, June 8, the Red Rose Chorus Barbershop Quartet will perform at 2 p.m. New crafts this year will include weaving, broom making, decorating furniture and the making of dulcimers.

Visitors will be able to see the Veterinary Office, Isaac Landis Gallery, and the Grossmutter House; areas open only on special occasions.

Admission for Craft Days is \$4 for adults; \$3 for senior citizens; \$2 for youth (6-17); and children under six are admitted free of charge. Members of the Landis Valley Associates will also be admitted free of charge.

The Pennsylvania Farm Museum of Landis Valley is located four miles north of Lancaster on Route 272, the Oregon Pike. For further information, call (717) 569-0401.

The top teams from each county compete in the area contests, with winners there going on to eastern Pennsylvania competition and state FFA competition.

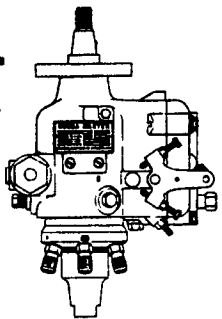
