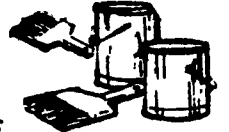

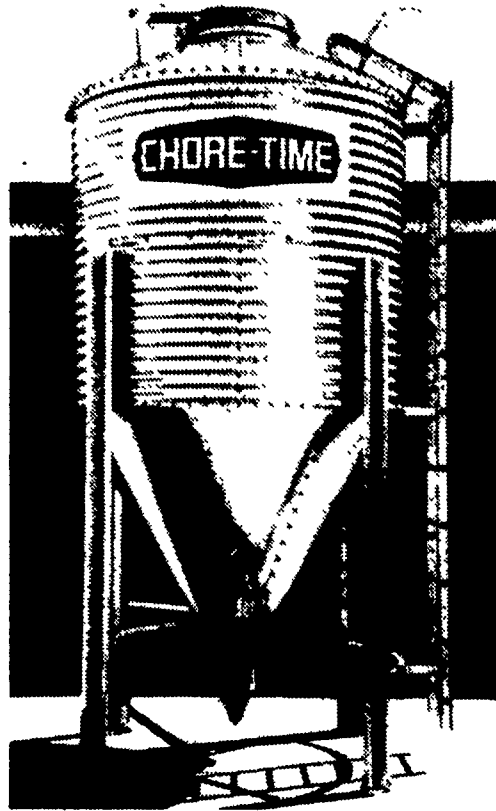

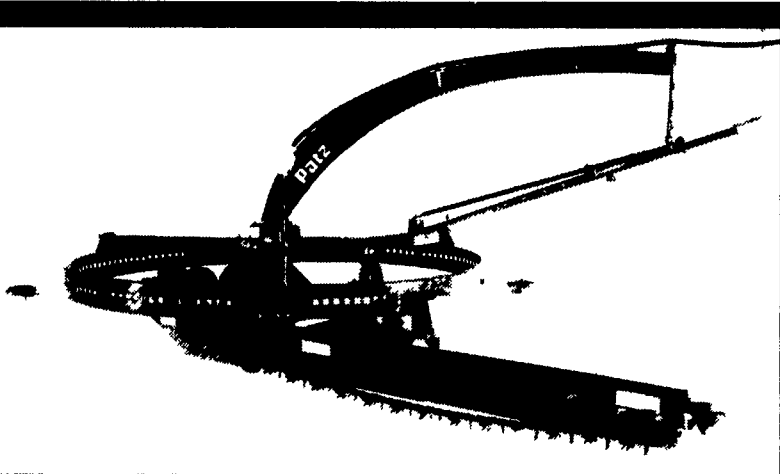

New ring drive for the Patz Model RD-820 Silo Unloader

NEW RING-DRIVE: Models with the new roller-chain ring drive use only one motor to power the machine.

AUTOMATIC LOWERING: An electric winch lowers the RD-820 automatically after each complete revolution.

GATHERING CHAIN: The Patz cutters and claws cut loose frozen and hard-packed silage efficiently, and then move it to the blower fast.
