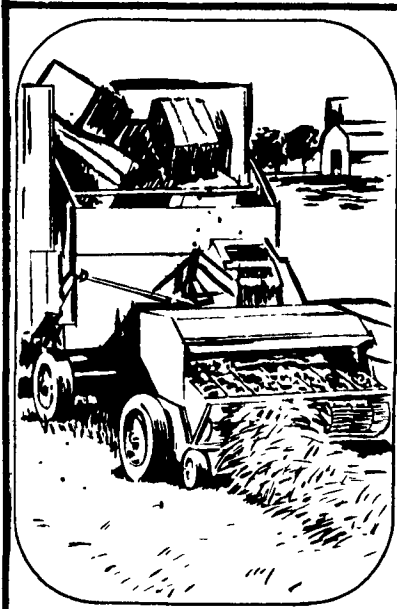

University of Maryland Ag Students Honored

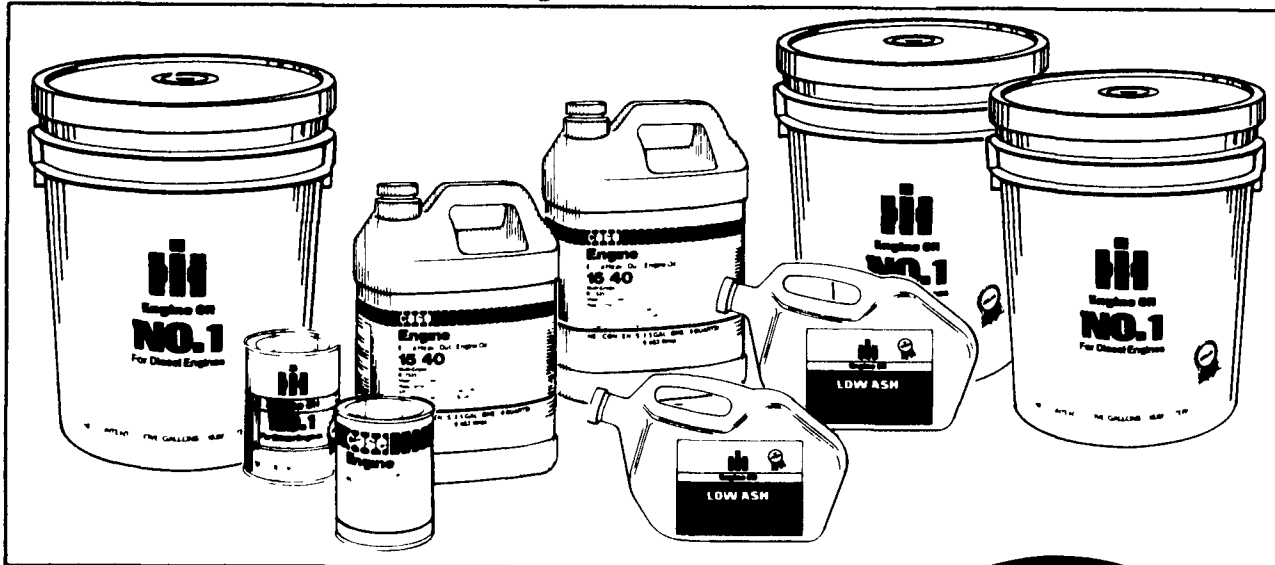
