Market Comment: Movement of ready to cook whole birds continued moderate, and sufficient to keep offerings fairly wellbalanced. Advanced interest was noted as moderate to good, particularly in the New England area where featuring was planned on both whole birds and parts. Demand for parts was fair to good, and premiums continued to be paid in most instances for additional product. Less than trucklot asking prices were generally unchanged at 57-61 cents. Live supplies continued adequate. Weights were irregular in a range of light to heavy. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy. The undertone was a bit steadier.


