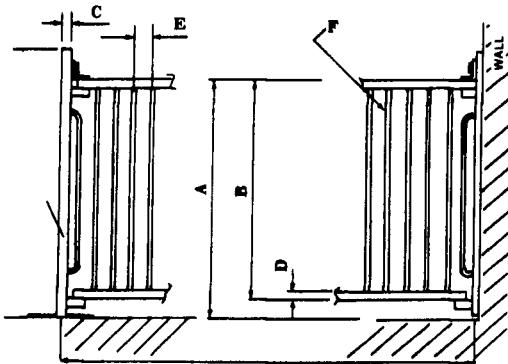
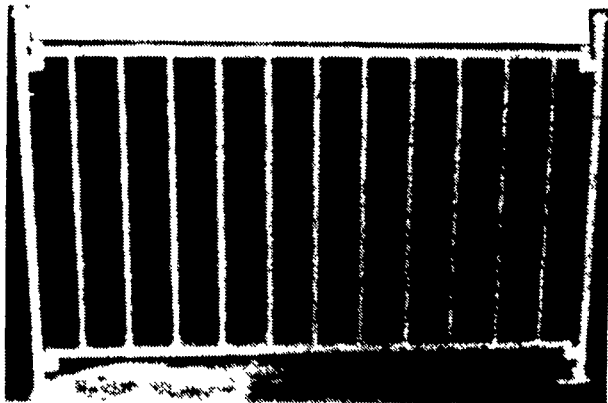
Teresa Marie Gawrys will serve as the spokesperson of the dairy industry for Clarion and Venango Counties as their 1986 Dairy Princess.

Cream should be among the last purchases at the grocery store and should be refrigerated at home as soon as possible. Kept in its closed carton at 40°F or lower, it will stay fresh for about one week. Ultra-pasteurized cream keeps well up to eight weeks before opening; then its life equals that of pasteurized cream.

Store cottage cheese as you would fresh milk—refrigerated and tightly covered. To preserve its freshness, take it from the refrigerator only long enough to remove the required amount of cheese for the meal or the recipe. When stored tightly covered at 35° to 40°F, it should stay at peak flavor and texture for 7 to 10 days.

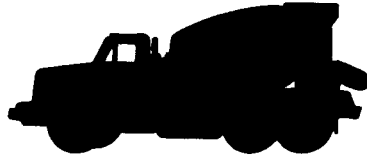
