Market Comment: Prices continued to advance on all sizes. Distributive activity was moderate to mostly good and was usually noted as stimulated by retail features both plant and in progress. Graded supplies of extra large were adequate to short; large were in balance to occasionally tight and medium were no more than adequate. Jumbos were seasonally short and small were at least adequate at most points. Breaker interest was light to fair. Gradable offerings were light and firmly held.
