Market Comment: Prices were again higher on the large sizes, unchanged on mediums. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm although cautious in spots. Movement remains mostly fair and about average for the latter part of the month. Floor stocks were a bit irregular, ranging adequate at some points to well-cleared and short at others, particularly on jumbos and extra large. Nest runs were no more than adequate and in instances packers have been closing early due to lack of gradable receipts. Breaker interest is usually satisfied with medium and lighter weight supplies.

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds and parts was mixed but generally slower and often noted as typical of a lighter Wednesday buyer interest. Most sellers noted various part items as available, particularly the breast complex. However, all were viewing pre-committed product coupled with weekend needs as creating a

general confidence in condition approaching the holiday. LTL asking prices were unchanged at 65-71 cents. Live supplies were adequate to barely adequate. Weights were mostly desirable to light. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy. The undertone remained fully steady to firm.

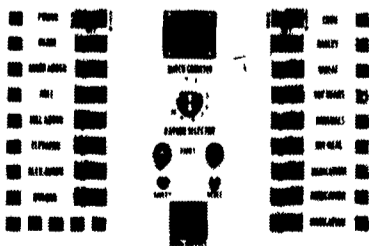
