## Western Berks Dairy Club

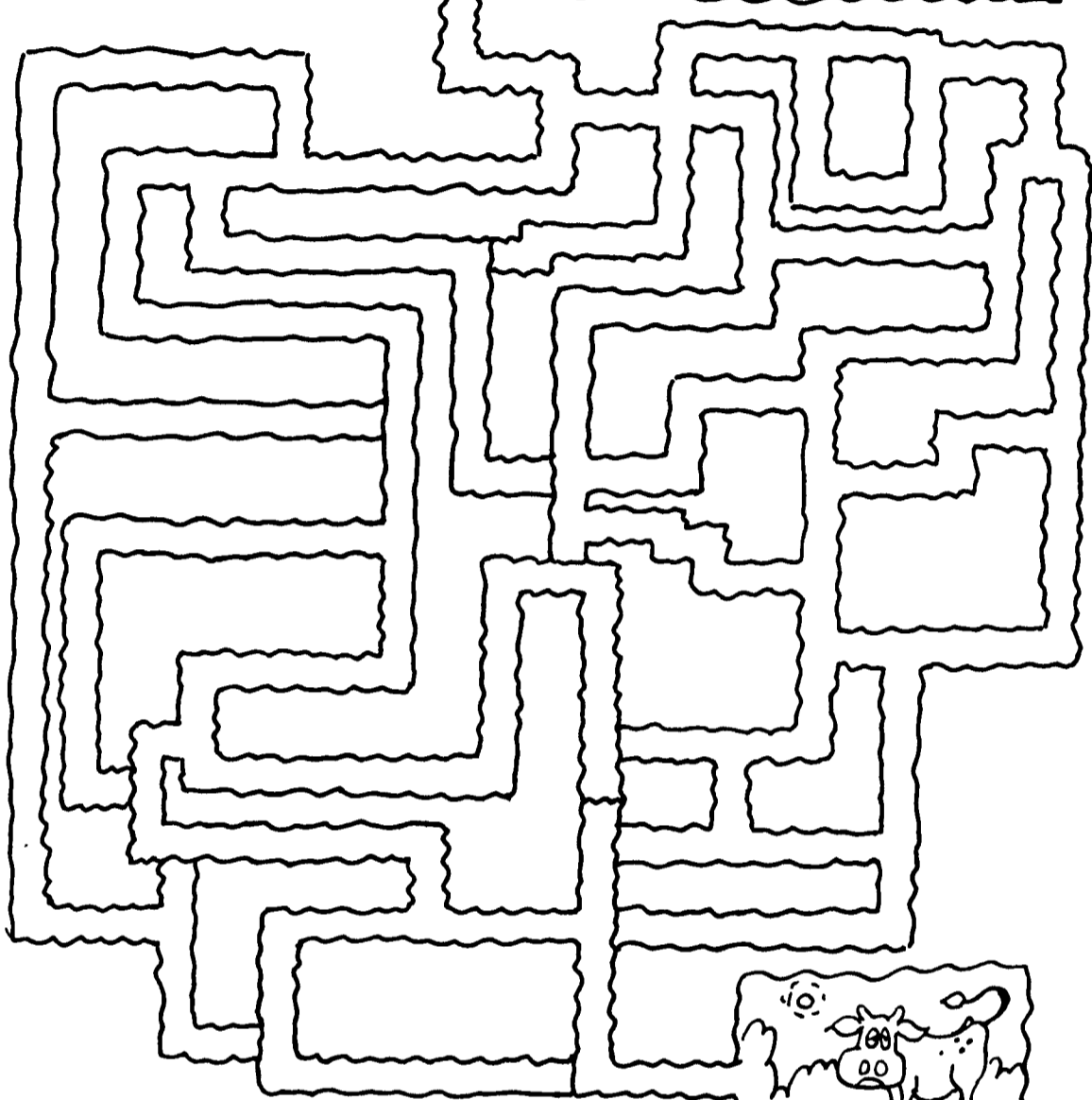
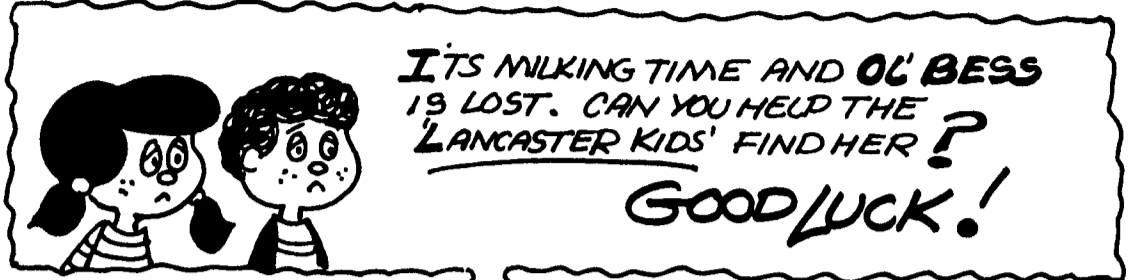
