## **Major Dairy Sales** And Dispersals 4 **Nationwide**

Reports from five sales for the week of July 10 to 17 showed 200 head averaging \$1,729.88. These sales were held in Canada, Michigan, Vermont, Minnesota, and Iowa. The top prices at the sales ranged from \$24,000 to \$1,250. Here is a brief look at the results of

## **JERSEYS**

The QUALITY CLASSIC SALE. held in Canada, averaged \$2,405 on 37 head. A yearling bull topped this sale with a price of \$15,000. He is the son of Valleystream Silver Beacon, the highest rated bull in Canada, and Mike's Little Nancy, the highest classified cow in Canada at EX-97. She has three records over 15,000 pounds of milk.

Second in the bidding, with a

price of \$4,800 was a 4-year-old by Merrymaker. As a 3-year-old she produced 16,000 pounds of milk and is classified Very Good.

A Milestone Master C daughter rounded out the top three with a bid of \$4,400. This 3-year-old was the Junior Champion at the CNE and the second place yearling at the All-American in Louisville.

The ALLEGAN BREEDERS CLASSIC, held in Michigan, averaged \$1,374 on 54 head. The highest bid of the day was \$4,500 on a Glendell Arlinda Chief daughter. She is due to freshen this month with a Sweet-Haven Tradition calf. Her dam is a Elevation daughter

with a lifetime production of 156,000 pounds of milk and 5,215 pounds of fat.

A Marshfield Elevation Tony daughter sold for the second high price of \$3,500. This just fresh 2year old has produced, in 46 days, 3,246 pounds of milk and 113 pounds of milkfat. Her dam is a Perfector daughter with a top record of 23,245 pounds of milk and 798 pounds of

Third in the bidding, with a price of \$2,450, was a VG-85 Bell daughter. This 3-year old has a high record of 18,560 pounds of milk and 623 pounds of fat. Her dam has records up to 20,000 pounds of milk.

The GOLDEN GOPHER SALE. held in Minnesota, averaged \$2,261 on 42 head.




